

## STAR SHINES IN L.A.

It was a classic comeback story starring one of golf's leading ladies as Brooke Henderson erased a four-stroke deficit to start the day, coming up big again and again to win the HUGEL-Air Premia L.A. Open on Saturday at Wilshire Country Club, her 10<sup>th</sup> LPGA victory.

Canada's winningest player of all time striped fairways (50 of

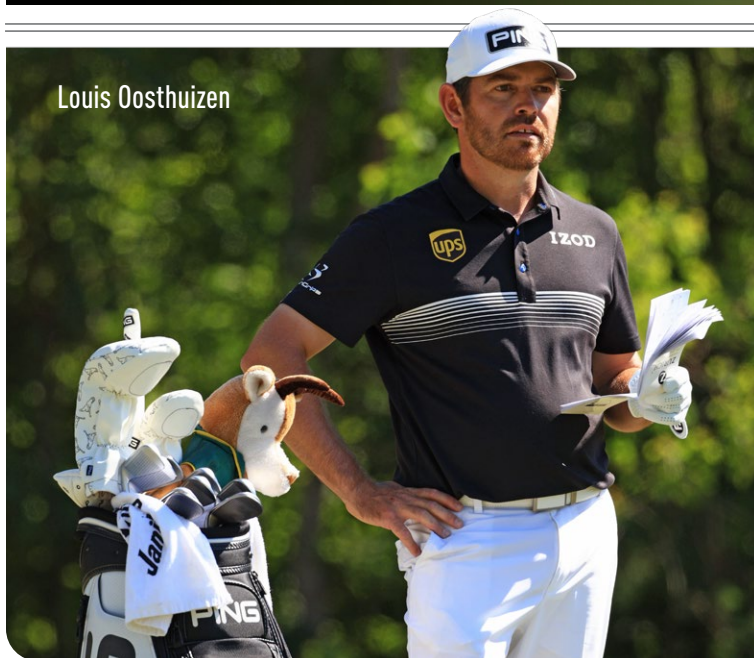
56), stuck greens (15 of 18 in the final round), chipped in, drained lengthy putts, and her clinching up-and-down par save on the 72<sup>nd</sup> hole was in her words, "Definitely very clutch." The 23-year-old, now fifth in the world ranking, has won in six of her seven seasons on tour, and she tallied two victories every year between 2016 and 2019.

## OLYMPIC AMBITIONS

At the Zurich Classic of New Orleans, Louis Oosthuizen was in a sense playing for his country, and his P2 finish improved his chances to represent home in the official sense at the summer Olympics in Japan. He is 33<sup>rd</sup> in the world ranking, which essentially mirrors the Olympic Golf Rankings qualifying list for men and the Rolex Rankings

for women.

Men's qualifying ends June 21<sup>st</sup>, but using the April 20<sup>th</sup> ranking here's how PING pros are positioned: Matthias Schwab would play for Austria; Corey Connors, Mackenzie Hughes, Canada; Joaquín Niemann, Chile; Sebastián Muñoz, Colombia; Victor Perez, France;

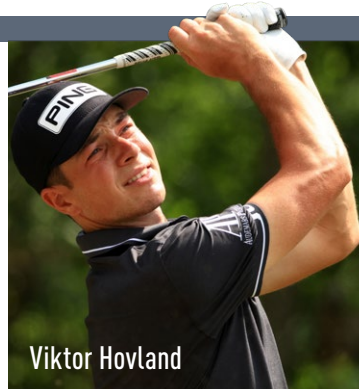
When does a T5 go from being a good result to a great result? For Angela Stanford it meant that she'd reached a career milestone with her 100<sup>th</sup> career top 10, which she earned Saturday at the HUGEL-Air Premia L.A. Open. The 43-year-old Texan, who topped \$12 million in earnings in the process, has seven LPGA wins, including the 2018 Evian Championship, and she's played on six U.S. Solheim Cup teams.
